Who: The event will feature two directors of research from the Federal Reserve System:

David E. Altig, Ph.D., is executive vice president and director of research at the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta. In addition to advising the Bank president on monetary policy and related matters, Dr. Altig oversees the Bank's regional executives and the Bank's research department. He also serves as a member of the Bank's management and discount committees. He leads the Atlanta Fed's macroblog, which provides commentary on economic topics, including monetary policy, macroeconomic developments and the Southeast economy.

Mine K. Yücel, Ph.D., is senior vice president and director of research at the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas. She has been with the Bank since 1989 and has been head of the Bank's micro/regional/energy group and director of publications for many years. Dr. Yücel analyzes the regional economy and energy markets on an ongoing basis and has published numerous articles on energy and regional growth. She will speak specifically on energy at the Feb. 2 event.
